## Eligibility requirements for first-time freshmen <br> to play sports in high school

## DRIVER'S EDUCATION



- 30 hours of classroom instruction, 6 hours of behind-the-wheel training
- Classes are offered after school and in the summer
- Listen to announcements at school about signing up for a class
- Students must pass 3 out of 4 classes each semester to get and keep a permit or license


## HIGH SCHOOL TESTING

DO NOT ENTER

- AP Exams - required exam for all Advanced Placement courses
- EOC (End-of-Course)/CTE exams - required state exams for specific high school courses
- Pre-ACT - required for all $10^{\text {th }}$ graders - given for free at school during a regular school day (practice ACT)
- ACT - required for all $11^{\text {th }}$ graders - given for free once at school during the regular school day - taken for 4-year college admissions
- PSAT - offered to any $10^{\text {th }} / 11^{\text {th }}$ grader, but is not required (practice SAT) - student pays to test
- SAT - offered on Saturdays, but not required - taken for 4-year college admission purposes - student must register themselves online and pay to test
- ASVAB - offered to any $11^{\text {th }} / 12^{\text {th }}$ grader, but not required - military entrance exam - given for free to students who sign up to test
- WorkKeys - required for $12^{\text {th }}$ graders who have a CTE concentration - given for free during the regular school day

## CHOOSING QUALITY/RIGOR - AP

- The College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) courses are college-level classes that you can take while still in high school. They offer challenging coursework!
- The benefits of taking AP courses are:
- To stand out in college admissions (Choosing rigor \& building your GPA)
- To earn college credit
- To skip introductory courses in college
- Please note AP courses are Writing Intensive. $8^{\text {th }}$ graders should be enrolled in English I now to be eligible for the AP Science Course Track.

## CHOOSING QUALITY/RIGOR - CCP

## Page 4 in packet

- Career and College Promise (CCP) is a program for current high school students in the $11^{\text {th }}$ or $12^{\text {th }}$ grade that have an unweighted GPA of $2.8+$
- CCP is also available for $9^{\text {th }}$ and $10^{\text {th }}$ grade AIG students who have met select eligibility requirements. Rising $9^{\text {th }}$ grade AIG students interested in taking CCP courses will be notified by their 8th grade School Counselor about a required CCP meeting on a date TBA
- CCP are college-level classes taken through Lenoir Community College. Students can earn college credits as well as high school credits.
- CCP courses listed on the General Education College Transfer Pathways will transfer to a 4-year college/university with a grade earned of "C" or better.

## TRANSFER CROSSWALK (4-Year COLLEGE)

Page 5 in packet

- Eligible students should plan to take a combination of AP and CCP courses while in high school.
- CCP courses and AP courses carry the highest quality points (5.0) and help build a strong grade point average (GPA).
- Some CCP and AP courses substitute/supplant graduation required courses (p. 4)
- Eligible students that plan ahead can maximize their opportunity to gain free college credit while in high school.
- Students should check online to determine exactly what college course credits they have obtained with qualifying AP scores.
- It is best practice not to take CCP courses that a student already has credit for based on their AP scores.
- Rising 9 $^{\text {th }}$ grade AIG students interested in taking CCP courses will be notified by their 8th grade School Counselor about a required CCP meeting on a date TBA

Note: If you are currently in English I (High School Credit), then you will register for English II or Honors English II.

Note: Honors Courses require an average of 80 or higher in the English course in which you are currently enrolled.

1. Foundations of Math I/Math I yearlong OR just Math
2. Math II or Honors Math II
3. Math III or Honors Math III
4. Math beyond Math III (many available options)

Note: If you are currently in $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math, then you will register for Foundations of Math I \& Math I (yearlong) unless your current middle school math teacher recommends you for just Math I in one semester.

Note: If you are currently in Math I (High School credit), then you will register for Math II or Honors Math II. Students currently in Math I may double-up in Honors Math II and Honors Math III.

Note: Honors Courses require an average of 80 or higher in the math course in which you are currently enrolled.

1. Earth Science or Honors Earth Science or Honors Biology * (AP Course Track)
2. Physical Science or Honors Chemistry
3. Biology or Honors Biology or AP Environmental Science

Note: Most incoming 9th graders will register for Earth Science or Honors Earth Science. Students that have taken Earth Science in $8^{\text {th }}$ grade can either skip taking a science in $9^{\text {th }}$ grade or register for Honors Biology*(see AP Course Track Eligibility).

Note: Honors Courses require an average of 80 or higher in the science course in which you are currently enrolled.

Note: *AP Course Track Eligibility: Eligible incoming freshmen recommended for the AP science course track should register for Honors Biology. This AP Science Course track requires that a student be enrolled in English I as an 8th grader AND have a final average of 90 or higher in 8th grade science.
